RALLY RECIPE: Rote Grütze German Mixed Berry Pudding

Ingredients:

2 ¼ lbs. of any red fruit in any combination (currants, raspberries, strawberries, brambleberries, cherries)
½ cup sugar
1 quart of water
½ cup cornstarch
1 cup rum (optional)
1 package instant vanilla pudding and other required pudding ingredients
1 cup 2 percent milk
Milk or cream (optional)

Directions:

- 1. Wash fruit and pick through for stems. Set aside ³/₄ cup of fruit.
- 2. Set aside 1 cup of water. Combine the remaining fruit with the remaining water and sugar in a saucepan.
- 3. Bring mixture to a boil and cook fruit over medium heat until done, but still holding its shape.
- 4. Sweeten to taste with more sugar, if needed.
- 5. Stir cornstarch into reserved water and stir until dissolved.
- 6. Stir into the fruit mixture and bring to boil, cook until thickened. Remove from heat.
- 7. Blend in the rum if desired.
- 8. Mash reserved, uncooked fruit in blender and stir into the thickened cooked fruit mixture. Refrigerate (if desired).
- 9. Make vanilla cream sauce by preparing vanilla pudding mixture as directed on the package and adding an additional 1 cup of milk for a creamier consistency.

The mixed berry pudding can be served hot or cold with cold or warm vanilla cream sauce or plain milk or cream.

Makes 8 servings.
