RALLY RECIPE: Mountain Man Breakfast

You will need a 12- inch Dutch oven to make this recipe. To cook over an open fire, light the charcoal briquettes so they reach the white ash stage prior to starting the cooking. You will need 10 coals on the bottom and 16 coals on the top to create an oven temperature of 350 degrees. This recipe can be cooked in a conventional oven at the 350 degrees.

Ingredients:

1 pound bulk breakfast sausage 2 pounds hash brown potatoes 1 medium onion, chopped 2 Tbsp. oil 8 eggs, beaten

2 cups grated cheddar cheese



Directions:

- 1. Cook sausage, breaking up large clumps until no longer pink. Add onion and cook until tender. This can be done in advance if desired.
- 2. Coat the bottom and sides of Dutch oven with oil.
- 3. Add hash browns, sausage/onion mixture, and eggs to the Dutch oven. Top with cheese.
- 4. Cover and bake for 45 minutes or until toothpick inserted in center comes out clean.

Serves 8-10 people.

The park and resort offer golfing, fishing, hiking and the Historic S*A*M Excursion Train that goes from the campground to Plain, GA at 10:00 a.m. on Friday and Saturday. For tickets and additional information go to www.samshoreline.com.
